What is ND Family Support?

What is ND?

The ND in our name stands for neurodevelopmental, as we support families at any point on the neurodevelopmental pathway; before, during and after assessment and diagnosis for a neurodevelopmental condition.

ND is also short for

- neurodivergent a way of describing people whose brains work differently in one ways from what is considered standard or typical (neurotypical)

 • neurodiversity - the idea that everyone
- thinks and processes the world differently and all perspectives deserve to be seen, valued and treated equally

How do we support you?
