Re-Start A Heart Day: 16 October 2024

Owl Class took part in restart a Heart Day takes place this week. Learning and practicing CPR and defibrillation skills on their teddies and soft toys.

The Resuscitation Council UK along with the British Heart Foundation, British Red Cross, St John Ambulance, the Association of Ambulance Chief Executives, NHS England, Save a Life for Scotland, Save a Life Cymru, and Northern Ireland Ambulance use the day to work together to help raise awareness of cardiac arrest and teach CPR.



Last year, the focus was on the importance of defibrillators during a cardiac arrest, how to use them, and the importance of them being registered on The Circuit. This year's focus is to get as many people as possible trained in CPR and defibrillation skills through the free online training tool. To find out more here.

What is ND Family Support?

ND is also short for

- neurodivergent a way of describing people
 whose brains work differently in one or more
 ways from what is considered standard or typical (neurotypical)
- neurodiversity the idea that everyone thinks and processes the world differently and all perspectives deserve to be seen, valued and treated equally

Who can use the service?

ND Family Support is for any East Sussex or Brighton & Hove parent carer with a child or young person under 25, at any stage on the neurodevelopmental pathway, from looking into getting a referral for assessment to post diagnosis/assessment.

Your child does not need to have a diagnosis to get support.


