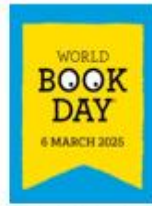

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World Book Day 6th March 2025!

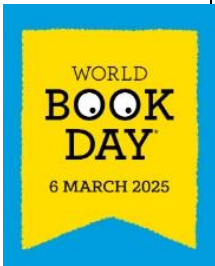
