Children aged 4-11 are invited to take part and collect rewards for their reading, giving them a positive experience of reading for pleasure. It's <b>FREE</b> to take part. The Challenge is to read any six books borrowed from the library or downloaded from the <a href="#">ebook library</a>. 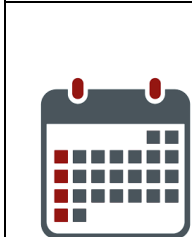
### [Have Your Details Changed?](#)
