School Games Mark





Join your local parent carer forum

What is a parent carer forum?

East Sussex Parent Carer Forum is a parent-led organisation working to ensure that every parent carer in East Sussex feels that their voice, views, and experiences matter

and contribute towards developing and improving services that impact the lives of our children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

Are you a parent or carer of a child or young person age 0-25 with a special educational need or disability?

Who can join?

Parents or carers with a child or young person age 0 to 25 with an additional need or disability are welcome to join. You must either live in East Sussex or your child/ young person must be using East Sussex services. Your child or young person does not need a clinical diagnosis in order for you to join.

How?

We work by reaching out to hear your views, representing your experience and

expertise and making recommendations for service improvement to decision-makers from the local authority and the Clinical Commissioning Group in all areas of education, health, and social care.

You can join the forum and share your views by completing the membership form on our website. You can comment on our Facebook page, reply to tweets, take part in polls and surveys, or become an ESPCF representative
