

Children in Year 3 and above may get free school meals if their parents or carers get any of these benefits:</li> <li>Universal Credit - GOV.UK (with an annual household income below £7,400 after tax, not including other benefits).</li> <li>Income Support - GOV.UK</li> <li>Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA) - GOV.UK</li> <li>Income-based Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) - GOV.UK</li> <li>Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 - GOV.UK</li> <li>The Guaranteed element of State Pension Credit - GOV.UK</li> <li>Child Tax Credit - GOV.UK (with an annual household income less than £16,190).</li> <li>Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit). Anyone who gets Working Tax Credit itself, won't get free school meals.</li> </ul>
