Important Notice: In August 2024, the Department of Education issued new
 statutory guidance for school attendance. In response, the school's attendant policy has been updated. A copy is available to view above. The guidance for requesting a withdrawal from learning, including holidays, h been updated, taking into account national and local procedures. If a request unauthorised, the Legal Interventions Team at East Sussex County Council be notified of the absence taken, and a legal intervention may be instigated i the form of a Penalty Notice. If a Penalty Notice is issued, it will be issued to each parent for each child taken out of school. Please note: From 19 August 2024, a limit of no more than 2 penalty notices issue to the same parent for the same pupil within a 3-year rolling period w apply. The first penalty notice issued to the parent for that pupil will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days reducing to £80 if paid within 2 days. Where it is deemed appropriate to issue a second penalty notice, the second notice is charged at a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days. A third penalty notice will not be issued within a 3-year period. Therefore, in cases where the threshold is met for a third (or subsequent) time within those 3 years, a penalty notice cannot be issued, and alternative action will be taken instead. This will often include considering prosecution but may also involve other tools such as one of the other attendance legal interventions. If you do not pay the penalty notice, legal action will result. Where withdrawal from learning requests for four days or less is made or more than one occasion during an academic year, this may also be referred the Legal Interventions Team at East Sussex County Council, resulting in a Penalty Notice being issued. If a Penalty Notice is issued, the same condition listed above will apply.
