Le Rette Farm Visit

A Wonderful Learning Experience

We were delighted to take the children on a fantastic day out to **La Rette Farm**, where Anna and her team provided an engaging and educational experience from start to finish. The children were *beaming* all day as they explored the farm and took part in a variety of hands-on activities.

Many of the pupils were able to interact with animals they had never seen before — not only common farm animals, but also some rarer ones, including an **emu**. This sparked lots of curiosity and conversation, helping the children build confidence around animals and learn more about the natural world.

During the visit, the children also learned about **soil health** and even had the opportunity to plant their own **wool**, giving them a memorable introduction to how different materials break down and support growth. Anna’s team demonstrated the importance of caring for the land and maintaining healthy soil, linking beautifully to our lessons on sustainability.

The day also offered valuable insights into **everyday farming life**, how food and products are made, and the role farms play in looking after the environment. By getting involved in real activities, the children deepened their understanding of where things come from and why sustainable practices matter.
